


Adult and Family Literacy Education in Pennsylvania

 Pennsylvanians
 do not have a

 diploma.
- 1,117,169 PA
 adults lack
 English language
 proficiency.
- 67,861 PA
 students dropped
 out of high
 school in the last
 5 years.

Adult basic and career education provides HSE credentials and essential skills that are gatekeepers to post-secondary education and job training.

Adult basic and career education needs flexible resources to accelerate employability and employment by contextualizing basic skills to employer needs.

CLARITY & ACCURACY

Rename line item in the PDE's Budget to "Adult Basic and Career Education" to better reflect actual programming and expand support for these investments.

RESOURCES & IMPACT

An infusion of \$33.3 million will move more adults into middle-skills work and help employers fill openings.

IMMEDIATE IMPACT



FUTURF-PROOF

\$18.3 million will expand access to high quality robust adult basic and career education for 9,000+ adults across Pennsylvania.

\$15 million funds a competitive grant (Adult Education and Workforce Recovery Fund) to catalyze creation of innovative programs that meet urgent employer needs.
