This interactive workshop shows teachers how to incorporate research-based Fluency, Comprehension, and Vocabulary strategies into their classrooms. Teachers will learn pre-, during and post-reading strategies that require students to reread a text multiple times in order to understand it deeply.

GED Overview: New Tools and Resources for Educators and Students

This session will take a comprehensive look at the GED program. Participants will learn about the latest outcomes research on GED test-taker performance and also get insights on the latest tools and resources from GED Testing Service.

Goal Setting to Empower Beginning English Learners

How can teachers determine what English learners want to be able to do with English in their lives? This interactive session demonstrates several strategies that give teachers valuable information about learners' goals and ways to empower them to achieve.

Recycling language in meaningful ways is both essential and empowering. This highly interactive session engages participants in practical routines that demonstrate how to balance listening, speaking, reading and writing to support the learning of vocabulary, grammar and pronunciation.

STEM: A 21st Century Literacy It's Dangerous to Ignore

Science, Technology, Engineering and Math (STEM) literacy is essential for success in the new economy. According to the U. S. Department of Commerce, STEM occupations are growing at 17%, while other occupations are growing at 9.8%. If you consider mid-level STEM occupations such as advanced manufacturing, the percentage is even higher. STEM degree holders have a higher income even in non-STEM careers. The world has fundamentally changed and unless adult education programs change their approach to literacy, family-sustaining employment may continue to elude adult learners.

Success, Literacy, and Learning: Experiences of Adult Education Students

This session explores six adult education students' ideas of success. Participants will consider ways students' views could inform their teaching and administrative practices and how students' perspectives compare to current discourse of the College and Career Readiness Standards (CCRS).

This session will guide healthcare faculty through a process of supporting students in becoming mindful practitioners using a 10-point ability-based assessment scale over the course of 3 semesters; although it can be adapted to across any length of time.

Understanding Learning Difficulties in Adult Education: A Teacher Perspectives

The need to understand the learning difficulties of adult learners has become a core aspects of research in adult education. Hence, this study will help Adult Education facilitators to understand the psycho-socio factors affecting adult learning and proffer solutions.

Understanding Your Learners' Data Flow

Participants will create a diagram to illustrate their program's data flow. This will give participants an opportunity to look at their procedures related to data collection and entry, and to highlight areas where they can improve their data flow.

Using Communicative Learning Objectives to Accelerate Job Related Skills

Using the Department of Labor Statistics work skills database as a reference, this research based session will explore how to target desired language proficiency against the knowledge, skills and abilities related to a job for accelerated career pathways success.

Using Digital Storytelling to Assess Speaking with ESL Learners

This presentation/workshop is designed for ESL instructors. Participants will learn how to integrate video and audio recording technology by using smartphone devices in lessons to create formative assessment opportunities. Participants will have the opportunity to do sample assessments.

Using Google Apps for Volunteer Management and in the Classroom

Learn about Google's free suite of apps and how these tools can make engaging with volunteers and students easier and more effective! We'll discuss ideas for use for tutors and teachers as well as for coordinators and program staff. Total beginners to Google Apps are welcome.

Using instructional design to develop a successful IET Program

The District 1199C Training & Upgrading Fund will discuss how they used a systematic instructional design process to develop their ESL Home Health Aide IET program and will share the method to help you get started on your own.

Using Results from the Program for the International Assessment of Adult Competencies (PIAAC) 2012/2014 to Build Partnerships and Improve Outcomes

PIAAC is a large-scale assessment of adults' cognitive and workplace skills. Using PIAAC data on low-skilled adults to explore relationships between foundation skills, educational attainment, and workforce outcomes, our presentation will inform how adult educators approach their work.

Using the TI-30XS Calculator

I can't do fractions but I passed my GED! The presentation will demonstrate how to use the TI-30XS calculator efficiently and effectively to pass the GED Math section. (It is recommended, participants bring a TI-30XS calculator)
